The Christingle Service is an Advent tradition in Saint Columba's Church! Brought to you by the Praise 'n' Pizza people, it is a family-friendly service (approx. 45 minutes) where a candle in an orange is used as a fun and interactive symbol of Jesus Christ and the positive effect he has had on the world.

The word 'Christingle' comes from the German word of 'Christkindl' which means 'Little Christ Child'. The Christingle is used to celebrate and symbolise Jesus Christ as the Light of the World.

The candles in the Christingles are lit to spread light. This reflects the light that Jesus Christ brings to the world, and gives hope to people living in dark times.

The Christingles are made by the children (with parental supervision/help!) during the service to help teach them about Jesus. Towards the end of the service, the lights are dimmed and the children's Christingles are lit up. It's a magical and reverential moment when the entire church is lit with the glow of the Christingles!

Remembrance Event Clonmethan 2024

In the hustle and bustle of daily life, it is easy to lose sight of the past as we focus on the present. Yet, Remembrance Sunday serves as a poignant reminder that it is because of the sacrifices of the past that we have the lives we lead today. It is a day to honour the soldiers and their families who gave so much during the First and Second World Wars, ensuring we have the freedoms we now enjoy.

This year, Andy Anderson, Stephen Vincent, and Niall Minto from the Grouped Parishes of Swords, Clonmethan and Kilsallaghan, with Donabate and Lusk, joined Peter Rooney and other members of the Friends of Clonmethan to pay tribute to the brave soldiers from the Fingal area who made the ultimate sacrifice.

The remembrance service was a fitting tribute, bringing together the community to reflect on the enduring legacy of these individuals. As each name was read aloud, their memory was brought vividly to life, bridging the gap between past and present.

Niall Minto read the ode and some prayers, while Stephen Vincent laid a wreath in their honour. We also remembered Ciarán Smith who died on Rescue 116. He made the supreme sacrifice "That Others May Live" - Go Mairidis Beo. There is a headstone dedicated to the Ciarán's memory in the graveyard.

Special thanks go to Andy Anderson and the Friends of Clonmethan for organising this meaningful event and providing the parishes with an opportunity to participate in this act of remembrance. Their efforts ensure that the sacrifices of these soldiers and their families are never forgotten, and their legacy continues.


