Billy Goodwin, representing Swords and Kilsallaghan, welcomed Neal. While two parishes with two separate vestries, they were all one happy family, and he looked forward to working together. Brian Scott, representing Donabate and Lusk, added their good wishes, saying that Donabate is committed to a project to build a new parish hall. He hoped that Neal would put an emphasis on both the spiritual and the material needs of the parish.

The new Rector thanked everyone from near and far for joining him for the occasion, his wife Lucy and their children Emily and Henry for their support, and the Archdeacon and Archbishop for their encouragement. "It was lovely to be back in Dublin and Glendalough and I look forward to ministry in this beautiful part of North County Dublin and to building the Kingdom of God in the parishes."
