### **Derek Evans**



Derek Evans passed away on Tuesday the 6<sup>th</sup> of May, a day after celebrating his 80th birthday.

Derek was originally from Arbour Hill in Dublin. He emigrated to London as a young man and developed his love of angling from fishing in the rivers, lakes and canals around the city. In time, he returned to Ireland and got a job as a printer with The Irish Times. Derek worked in printing at the newspaper for more than two decades, before becoming its angling correspondent.

Derek and his wife Marjorie had a long and devoted marriage, and together they raised their sons Mark, Peter, Simon and David, and their daughter Racheal. Derek and Marjorie were later blessed with thirteen grandchildren.

Derek was Saint Columba's primary fundraising expert until ill health prevented him from continuing in the role. It's not an overstatement to say that his input was crucial to the parish. The events he ran over the years were famous as community events as well as fundraisers, and his family and friends helped out with running them, notably the quizzes.

Derek gave many dedicated years of service as a Select Vestry member in Swords. His unflappable, farsighted, and charming personality made him both a pleasure to work with, and an inspiration as a colleague.

Lay minister David Snow, a family friend, assisted Reverend Yvonne Ginnelly in conducting Derek's funeral in Saint Columba's on the 9<sup>th</sup> of May. The packed and overflowing church was a testament to the high esteem in which Derek was held by so many.

Derek will be greatly missed.
