
Ongoing Works at St Columba's Church and the Towers

The Square and Round Tower were awarded a grant of &125,000 from the Community Monuments Fund recently towards the ongoing repairs to these historic monuments. We thank Minister Darragh O'Brien who secured this funding for us. However, the costs of the next stage of repairs comes to &190,000, leaving a shortfall of &70,000 approx. Thanks to Stephen Vincent in liaising with the conservation architects and the contractors to bring these works to fruition.



Works at St Columba's Church also continues. A new skylight in the attic which was leaking severely will be replaced in the coming weeks. The water damage to the East wall is a continuing problem which has caused a huge damp stain on the inside of the church. Until this problem is resolved there will be a delay in getting the church painted internally. The plaster work on the inside of the church may have to be taken down to investigate further where the problem lies.

The Church Windows also need to be repaired and estimates are being sought in this regard. The cost to have the windows repaired fully will possibly lie in the region of €250,000. We thank Eric Wolfe for his commitment and dedication in trying to get the church repaired.



St Mary's Church, Clonmethan


St Mary's Church Clonmethan which lies on the edge of Oldtown in North Co Dublin has been awarded &121,000 from the CMF grant. We again thank Minister Darragh O'Brien for making this award possible. The Friends of Clonmethan, who are a local group of people, formed a few years ago to restore the tower of Clonmethan Church and to the promote the churches long and significant history. The Church was closed in the 1960's but burials continue there. Alison Baker and Maud Keogh from Donabate & Lusk parish were parishioners who were buried there in recent years. The grant of &121,000 goes towards the restoration of the beautiful Church Tower.
