



### A Special Service of Thanksgiving at St David's Kilsallaghan

A special Service of Thanksgiving took place at Saint David's Kilsallaghan on Sunday, October 5th. We were delighted to welcome The Most Reverend Archbishop Doctor Michael Jackson to celebrate our Harvest Thanksgiving and bless the newly constructed Columbarium wall.

The service was led by Revd. Yvonne Ginnelly who was assisted by Diocesan Readers Doctor Niall Minto and myself, David Snow. It was wonderful to see the church crammed with parishioners and friends, all together for this double celebration.



Countless hours of work have gone into the restoration of Saint David's Church, and we are incredibly thankful for the kind assistance of the parishioners and neighbours. In particular, we appreciate the sterling work done by Fran and Ian Falkiner, Andy Anderson, and Ivan Ginnelly.

We are also most thankful to those who offered their skillset and attention to detail in perfecting the construction of the Columbarium wall.

We also received many donations and kind gifts, with a special mention for the local family, who generously provided many new furnishings for the church, including the new carpets.

The service began with a warm welcome to everyone, and Anna Gundersen opened the service with a delightful piece of music on the violin, assisted by her father on the piano. The wholehearted singing of the hymns was a testament to the full attendance. We were blessed to have Claire O'Connor playing the organ to accompany our singing.

# A Special Service of Thanksgiving at St David's Kilsallaghan, continued

The Most Reverend Archbishop Dr. Michael Jackson noted that Harvest is about counting our blessings, and while we were lucky to be well fed and enjoying a visit to the bucolic countryside on a sunny day, he balanced these remarks by providing some most solemn words on Gaza, and all the devastation and destruction that the war has brought to the civilian population of Gaza since the terrorist group Hamas attacked Israel on October 7th 2023, which we have sadly witnessed on our screens since the war began.

The collection from the service will be donated by the Archbishop to benefit medical care for all affected. Al Ahli Arab Hospital in Gaza city is supported by the Dioceses of Dublin and Glendalough through their relationship with the Diocese of Jerusalem. The Archbishop, who has attended the Diocese of Jerusalem's synod in Jordan multiple times and plans to attend the 2025 synod directly after our own synod in Dublin, has visited the region to show solidarity, has also led his own United Dioceses of Dublin & Glendalough appeal to support reconstruction efforts in the Middle East.

The service then moved to the graveyard, where the Archbishop dedicated the newly constructed Columbarium wall, concluding with the Lord's Prayer. It is hoped that the Columbarium, offering another option of a dignified resting place, will enhance the existing facilities of the churchyard.

Plenty of photographs were taken to mark the occasion, with many smiles contained, evidencing the delightful day we all shared.

Everyone enjoyed refreshments afterwards in the Church, and most importantly, the rain stayed away.
